THE CRIB Why is the Crib still here? It may seem strange that as Christmas is apparently over we keep our Crib in place in the Church. However, for Christians the celebration of Christmas does not end on Boxing Day, it goes on until the beginning of February when we keep the Feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple. This feast is often called "Candlemas" because at the service on that day worshippers are given candles in light in remembrance that Christ is called the Light of the world. So we keep our Crib for the whole Christmas period to remind us that we are in a season which remembers the coming of Christ.

WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY 2025 This is an annual initiative traditionally observed 18 - 25 January - the octave of St. Peter and St. Paul - whereby Christian communities throughout the world are invited to pray for one another and for greater Christian Unity. This year we are invited to reflect on the story of Martha's confession of faith in Jesus as narrated in John 11:17-27.
